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## Scope & Context:

#### Introduction:

### "Doing relationships":

"For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins." Matt6:14-15 NIV

"'A new command I give you: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13:34-35 NIVUK

#### "Doing relationships":

- It's impossible for us to love one another as Jesus loves us UNLESS we move in His strength and not in our own;
- Unless we are truly able to forgive one another then we cannot love one another;
- The extent to which we are able to forgive is an indication of The Holy Spirit's work within us.

#### Case Study:

#### Jonathan Aitken:

- Conviction for perjury brought the ex-Tory minister Jonathan Aitken notoriety. It also inspired his new calling as a prison chaplain;
- Aitken found God while serving seven months in prison for perjury in 1999 after he sued The Guardian for libel;
- He has described persuading his then teenage daughter to give him a false alibi as his "most shameful mistake";
- "cells can be great places to pray".

Westminster Confession of Faith (1646):

Peacemaking is NOT about Cowardice:

- NOT Avoiding;
- NOT Appeasing;
- NOT Running from from the problem or giving in.

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#### XIII Of Sanctification:

"...by His Word and Spirit dwelling in them: the dominion of the whole body of sin is destroyed, and the several lusts thereof are more and more weakened and mortified; and they more and more quickened and strengthened in all saving graces, to the practice of true holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord."

"Men ought not to content themselves with a general repentance, but it is every man's duty to endeavour to repent of his particular sins, particularly."

Westminster Confession of Faith (1646):

XV Of Repentance unto Life contd/:

"As every man is bound to make private confession of his sins to God, praying for the pardon thereof; upon which, and the forsaking of them, he shall find mercy; so he that scandeliseth his brother, or the Church of Christ, ought to be willing, by a private or public confession and sorrow for his sin, to declare his repentance to those that are offended; who are thereupon to be reconciled to him, and in love to receive him."

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### Within the body of Christ:

- True forgiveness requires us to face up to what has happened;
- Forgiveness isn't tolerating wrong;
- The alternative is that we will carry the load of un-forgiveness;
- Satan's paralysing stranglehold depends on our acceptance of his lies.

#### **Confession:**

- We are called to confess our sins to each other;
- Confession: an important element of forgiveness;
- Seeking God together whenever there may be a problem.

#### The purpose of forgiveness:

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails."

#### The purpose of forgiveness:

- To restore our relationship to bring about reconciliation;
- Love always hopes;
- Often we need help to forgive;
- Don't settle for second best.

The process of forgiveness should always bear witness to a community of authentic disciples of Jesus Christ.

#### Responding to the sins of others:

- Grief;
- Realism;
- Self examination;
- Forgiveness & reconciliation;
- New discipline.

#### The Cross & Communion:

"whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you <u>proclaim the Lord's</u> <u>death</u> until he comes." 1Cor11:26 NIVUK

The Cross: three key aspects:

- -forgiveness;
- -complete healing;
- -inclusion.

#### The Cross & Communion:

"'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Matt 11:28-30: NIVUK

- All are welcome in God's eyes.
