Latin - con venire - coming together

Covenant looks life a Contract

Vows are exchanged You write an account of your belongings You sign it and make a mark

But it is fundamentally different

Covenant looks life a Contract

Contract - When one part stops the contract becomes null and void

The effort is then about recovering what is owed or what was given

Covenant looks life a Contract

Covenant - Both parties uphold their end regardless of what the other does

Each party supports one another in doing everything they can to uphold each other's part of the agreement

(covenants can be broken Hosea 6:7, but there were severe consequence's for doing so - Our focus this morning is on staying in covenant)

The Blood Covenant

- 1. They Exchange Coats Everything I am now belongs to you
- 2. They exchange weapons All my strength is now yours
- 3. They exchange vows Promises to one another
- 4. The cut an animal in two and walk between it
- 5. They cut themselves and become blood-brothers
- 6. They account for each other belongings
- 7. They exchange names
- 8. They are pronounced friends

Grace Abounds

As Christians we are all in Covenant with one another

We still make deeper, closer covenants will key people

1 Samuel 18:1-4 Now when he had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul. ¿Saul took him that day, and would not let him go home to his father's house anymore. ¿Then Jonathan and David made a covenant, because he loved him as his own soul. And Jonathan took off the robe that was on him and gave it to David, with his armor, even to his sword and his bow and his belt.

They Renewed their Covenant - 1 Samuel 23:18

When I am in covenant with my brother everything I have is his.

Whenever he needs me I am there

I lay down my rights so that my covenant brother can flourish (Jonathan saw that God had anointed David as King and gave up his right to be king)

We speak into each others lives

God's Covenant in Marriage

Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. 24 Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything.

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, 20 that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, 27 that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. 25 Oo husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. 26 For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church. 30 For we are members of His body, 30 of His flesh and of His bones. 31 "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." 32 This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church. 33 Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

- This morning we will focus on the relationship between a husband and wife who are both seeking to work this out together within the covenant of marriage

The Husbands role to Love his wife like God Loves the Church

There is great beauty in working out the covenant relationship between Husband and wife

Relationship without the Covenant (marriage cert)

- We live in a time when we want all the benefits but we are not willing to commit to another person in marriage.
- We can use the threat that I am going to go as a way of getting what I want
